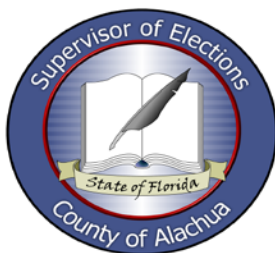

NEW VOTER REGISTRATION AND ABSENTEE BALLOT STATUS LOOKUP NOW AVAILABLE ONLINE

Voters in Alachua County can now verify their voter registration status and track their absentee ballot online at VoteAlachua.com. These new services are aimed at improving the voting process for all voters as well as military and overseas voters and will provide an opportunity for absentee voters to track their absentee ballots.

By clicking on the link, "**NEW - Check Your Voter Registration Status Here!**" voters will be directed to a secure page and will need to enter the required information. Once this step has been completed, the voter will be able to access the following information from the site:

- Verify if their voter registration information is current
- Access a form to update their registration
- Request and track the status of their absentee/mail ballot
- View their sample ballot, when available
- Obtain information on upcoming elections
- View their polling places and get directions
- View their voting activity
- View statistics about their precinct

2010 IMPORTANT ELECTION INFORMATION

General Election - November 2, 2010

Register to vote by October 4, 2010

Early Voting starts October 18, 2010

VOTE! IT'S AS EASY AS 1 – 2 – 3

There are 3 ways to cast a ballot in this election. Voters may choose to vote by mail, early vote or vote at their polling location on Election Day.

VOTE BY MAIL

Any registered voter may Vote by Mail. To request a ballot and Vote by Mail, voters may make their request online at VoteAlachua.com or call the Supervisor of Elections Office at (352) 374-5252. Voters will need to make sure their address and signature on file with the Supervisor of Elections is current. **Your mail ballot may not count if the signature does not match the signature on your voter record.** The last day to request your ballot be mailed for the General Election is Wednesday, October 27, 2010 by 5:00PM.

To request a ballot for another voter, you must be a designated member of the voter's immediate family or a legal guardian. Requests can be made online, in person, by mail, by telephone or by fax. All requests must include the voter's name, residence address, and date of birth. The request must also include the requestor's name, residence address, relationship to the voter and driver's license number if available. Mail or fax request must also include the requestor's signature.

A voter may designate in writing another person to pick up an absentee ballot starting Thursday, October 28, 2010. The designee must have a note signed by the voter, a picture identification of the designee and must complete an affidavit. The affidavit is available for download at VoteAlachua.com. The designee may not pick up more than two absentee ballots per election, not including the designee's own ballot and ballots for members of his or her immediate family.

Absentee ballots are available at the Supervisor of Elections Office for voters who may have emergencies that will not allow them to go to their polling place to vote.

All absentee ballots must be received in the Supervisor of Elections Office by 7:00PM Election Day.

VOTE EARLY

Any registered voter may vote early. Florida Law requires voters to present picture and signature identification in order to vote, or vote a provisional ballot. Early Voting for the Primary Election will be available starting **Monday, October 18, 2010 through Saturday, October 30, 2010.**

Early Voting will be available at the following times:

Weekdays, Monday – Friday (9am to 5pm)

October 18th through October 22nd

October 25th through October 29th

Saturday, October 23rd (9am to 1pm)

Sunday, October 24th (1pm to 5pm)

Saturday, October 30th (9am to 5pm) Early Voting Ends

VOTE AT YOUR PRECINCT

Any voter may vote in the precinct of their residence between 7:00AM and 7:00PM on Election Day. Florida Law requires voters to present picture and signature ID in order to vote, or vote a provisional ballot. If you need to locate your precinct, go to VoteAlachua.com.

**POLLING PLACE CHANGES FOR THE
2010 NOVEMBER 2ND GENERAL ELECTION**

Notices of precinct changes were mailed to Alachua County voters residing in Precincts 32, 39, and 49.

New voter registration information cards were mailed to Precinct 39, 48 and Precinct 49. Voters should make sure they do not throw away their new voter information card as it will contain their new polling location. Voters are asked to review their voter information to be certain it is current and correct. If any information is not current, please notify the Supervisor of Elections Office immediately.

Letters were mailed to voters residing in Precincts 32 regarding their **temporary** change in polling location. Voters are asked to review the letter and to call the Supervisor of Elections Office if they have any questions.

If a voter has moved and has not notified the Supervisor of Elections Office of their new address, they may not receive their new card or letter. They may go online at VoteAlachua.com to make a change of address or contact our office at (352) 374-5252. A new card will be mailed based on the updated information.
