## **Economic Uncertainties**

- Following a path in this historical time that most of us have not seen before
  - Economic decline is prolonged by continued high unemployment, slow housing sales, depressed consumer spending
  - County government is faced with the challenge of providing services to our citizens in these uncertain financial times





## The "New Normal" for Local Government

- The "new normal" is a term being used by private businesses and government organizations to describe the new way of doing business that will remain in place after the U.S. economy rebounds
  - The strategies put in place now will need to sustain us through the next few years





## The "New Normal" for Local Government

- For government, the public's concern over spending has led to efforts to permanently constrain local government revenues
- Unlike the situation with private businesses, the demand for public services often rises as revenues fall





## "A Community Budget"

"Citizens understand their household budgets, executives understand their organizational budget. The New Normal requires the community to consider the total 'Community Budget' available from all the resources of the non-profit and profit sectors within their community. Abundance comes from collaboration; not indebting future generations."






- Revenue calculation is based on taxable property values as determined by Property Appraiser's Office
  - 2007 Legislative Property Tax Reform limits growth from property tax revenue
  - January 2008 voter approved referendum increased property tax exemptions
    - Additional homestead, tangible personal property exemption, Save our Homes portability, 10% growth cap on non-homestead property





- Property valuation and tax exemptions
  - Only 52% of countywide property values are on the tax rolls
    - 64% of City of Alachua property values are on tax rolls
    - Marion County has 60% of property value on tax rolls
    - St. Johns County has 70% of property value on tax rolls


2009 Total Property Taxes - \$2,512

Total 2009 Tax Bill of \$2,512









## General Fund Expenditures - All Property Taxes of \$755 for FY10














## County Government Budget Overview


- Budgeting for local government

  - Broad range of county government responsibilities makes for complex accounting


















## Property Tax Revenue - General Fund Current Millage Rate for FY11







## Property Tax Revenue - General Fund State Millage Rate for FY11




