

AWARDS

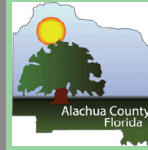

PARTICIPANTS

All middle school, high school and college students in Alachua County are invited to participate.

LOCATION

The competition will be held at the Florida Museum of Natural History, located at SW 34th St. and Hull Road. Participating students, their families and teachers are invited to attend the awards reception immediately following the judging.

ARTWORK CRITERIA

- Must be comprised of 70% or more recycled/recyclable/reused materials
- Must fit through a standard doorway
- No use of weapons, either knifelike or gunlike
- 50lb weight limit
- No easels provided
- Cannot be hung from the ceiling OR from the wall
- Cannot contain live materials
- Stand at a maximum of 9' high.
- Must be stable enough to be easily moved by staff
