## Notes from EPAC Member Nam Henderson from discussion with Mr. Brandon Kutner (County Commissioner Candidate)

- 1. Water issues most important environmental issue facing Alachua county in future. Mr. Kutner indicated he would be supportive of Alachua County joining up with Tri-County initiative or more general efforts at local control.
- 2. Alachua County voters have obviously made land conservation a priority however, growth isn't a bad thing. Growth can be tempered with environmental concerns. "All for LEED".
- 3. Regarding Plum Creek supports development of eastern side of county we shouldn't just be thinking about Plan East Gainesville. Also, is along transportation corridor lots of land in easement/conserved as part of development.
- 4. He believes county government is by nature designed to shrink over time with growth of municipalities.
- 5. Has concerns regarding how GRU restrictions/decisions on size of sewage main, infrastructure investment reducing ability of Hawthorne and Archer to grow.
- 6. While he agrees that budgets have been cut in recent years, thinks overall, total, county budget has gone up.
- 7. He would like to see more direct citizen participation, between BoCC and advisory boards. Not filtered through staff. Workshops vs informal meetings.
- 8. Not supportive of county efforts to develop CRA. County shouldn't be in business of re-development. Leave to municipalities.
- 9. Notes that much of the conservation lands in county in eastern portion, which reduces opportunities for development. Is interested in balancing development and growth.
- 10. Mr. Kutner offered examples of challenges for economic development such as the interaction between EPD and race track re: ULDC and zoning. As well as issues re classification for Hazmat (solvents + fuels). Indicated there may have been some distance between state documentation/req and generation of complaints from EPD?
