How to Buy S.M.A.R.T. There are four steps to becoming a Buy S.M.A.R.T. Smart Shopper:

What is Buy S.M.A.R.T.?

1. REDUCE

Reduce your garbage; buy in bulk and avoid individually-wrapped items. You will be amazed how much longer it will take to fill up your trash can if you avoid unnecessary packaging.

2. REUSE

Purchase items that can be washed and/or reused and avoid items that are used only once. By reusing plates, silverware and napkins, we are preserving natural resources instead of tossing them out after one use.

3. RECYCLE

Remember to use your orange and blue bins! Every time you recycle an aluminum can in your Big Blue bin, you are conserving enough electricity to run your TV for three hours!

4. CLOSE THE LOOP

Look for products made from recycled material. These can be identified by the recycled arrow symbol 🛞 and the percentage of recycled content. The majority of metal cans on the grocery store shelves have already been recycled.
