

Florida Water Star<sup>SM</sup> (FWS) is a voluntary water conservation certification program for new homes and commercial buildings that meet specific water-efficiency criteria for:

- Indoor fixtures and appliances
- Landscape design
- Irrigation systems

## \$700 Rebate Availability and Requirements

- The home must be FWS certified by a trained FWS certifier.
- Home plans must include a permanent inground irrigation system.
- Rebate funds are available for the first 150 properties to achieve FWS certification beginning April 10, 2017.

## **Builder Benefits**

- \$700 rebate per property.
- The County Irrigation Design Fees and Inspection process is waived for FWS homes.
- Trained Landscape and Irrigation Contractors —FWS Irrigation and Landscape Accredited Professionals in Alachua County have been trained to design and/or install systems meeting FWS criteria.
- Certifiers Available to Advise and Inspect FWS certifiers in Alachua County are available to assist in building to FWS criteria and inspect homes.
